## OCTOBER LUNCHEON PROGRAM

### **Pamela Goodman, LWV of Florida's Fair Districts Chair:**

#### **“Redistricting 2012: Are Legislators Looking for Loopholes or Following the Law?”**

In early September, a Federal Judge in Miami decided that Amendment 5, the “Fair Districts” amendment limiting how Florida congressional districts are drawn, did not violate the US Constitution. In spite of this, two members of the Florida House, Mario Diaz-Balart (R) and Corrine Brown (D) — both part of the original lawsuit, vowed to appeal to the Supreme Court.

The recent public hearing in Sarasota on redistricting was controversial, with State Senator Nancy Detert (R) scolding the audience for criticizing the process and threatening future funding for New College, the site of the hearing.

What happened at the other public hearings? What's the next step in the redistricting process?

We are pleased to welcome Pamela Goodman as our luncheon speaker on October 1 — **one week earlier than usual**. As Chair of the League of Women Voters of Florida's campaign for Fair Districts since 2006, Goodman is uniquely positioned to brief us on redistricting in Florida. She will provide insight on the recent ruling and appeal, as well as updates on the public hearings that have taken place across the state, and sum up where the process is

heading in the January legislative session.

Pamela Goodman was educated at the University of Iowa in Journalism and Business. She spent her professional career in retailing, beginning with Macy's in Kansas City, and subsequently with The Limited, Inc., rising to the position of President/CEO of Limited Express.

Goodman joined the League of Women Voters (LWV) in 2000, served as President of the LWV of Palm Beach County, 2005–9, and has been on the LWV Florida State Board of Directors since 2007. While serving in that role, she was appointed by the Palm Beach County Supervisor of Elections to head a review and audit of voting machines and processes for the 2006 and 2008 elections.

In addition to chairing the League's Fair Districts campaign statewide, she currently serves as 1st Vice President. She resides in Gulf Stream with her husband, Barry.

### **Last Month: Barbara Zdravecky: “Women Are Watching”**

“Women are Watching” was the theme when Barbara Zdravecky spoke at the September luncheon. The President/CEO of Planned Parenthood of Southwest and Central Florida characterized 2011 as “one of the most difficult years for women.” She watched with alarm as many states passed anti-choice and anti-woman legislation.

Women in Florida faced an “all-out assault on women and families” from Gov. Rick Scott and the Legislature. Instead of focusing on creating jobs — as they promised the voters in

2010 — they worked to curtail Floridians' access to health care, women's control over their own reproduction and, ultimately, protections afforded women by the Florida Constitution.

The federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (“Obamacare”) includes many provisions to promote healthy families, including well care for women, support for breastfeeding and domestic violence prevention. Rather than accept federal funding for

## Lovette W. Harper: A Life of Achievement

This month, longtime Democratic Club of Sarasota member Lovette W. Harper is being recognized by the Sarasota County NAACP with its Lifetime Achievement Award.

Lovette has been active in teaching and preserving African American history and African arts and culture both nationally and locally. A graduate of Tuskegee University, she spent many years teaching and traveling in Africa. During that time she started a collection of African art (primarily masks). Last year she donated many of those pieces to Tuskegee's new museum — enough to fill a wing named in her honor.

Since moving to Sarasota, she has continued her involvement, presenting exhibitions and conducting workshops at local schools, churches and libraries. A lasting contribution will be the formation of a Cultural Resource Center at North Sarasota Library to serve as a repository of materials on all aspects of the global Black experience and to provide outreach to the extended community in the form of programs and exhibits. As Chair of the Center, Lovette has made sure that it fulfills her vision. This year's program, "Newtown Then and Now," was enthusiastically received by the community.

## Last Month: Zdravecky “Women’s issues must be front and center in the 2012 elections”

health care for Florida’s families, Rick Scott is refusing to implement the health reform law. Consequently, Florida’s women pay more for health care than men do, and get less for their money.

The Republican majority in the Florida Legislature — members of a Party

famously opposed to “big government” and government interference in individuals’ lives — has decided to tell doctors how to practice medicine, requiring that women seeking abortions have an ultrasound. Zdravecky reported that having the ultrasound has not deterred any women from having an abortion, although this law raises its cost.

If passed by Florida voters, a new Florida Constitutional Amendment (#6 on the 2012 ballot) will be the strongest assault on women. It would prevent public funds from being used for health insurance that includes coverage for abortions (e.g., health benefits of public employees). In addition, it would specifically repeal the privacy rights in the Florida Constitution that courts used to declare previous anti-abortion legislation unconstitutional, opening the way to reinstate those laws.

Women are watching, Zdravecky says. In 2008 and 2010,

women voters were 53% of the electorate. In the past year, Planned Parenthood of America recruited 1 million new advocates — individuals who sign up to receive Action Alerts. Funding for Planned Parenthood in most states continues despite repeated efforts to de-fund, and 65% of Americans approve of this funding.

What all this means is that women must be pro-active in the 2012 election. We must make sure other women understand what’s at stake. We must be “messengers of what’s happening in Florida.” To keep abreast of the issues and opportunities for action, sign up for Planned Parenthood’s Action Alert Network by emailing Wendy.Grassi@ppswcf.org.
