

Florida Veterans for Common Sense present American Patriot Thomas Paine—Live!

Do you know who Thomas Paine was?

Paine was the first thinker to set forth cogent reasons for independence from England in his political pamphlet, *Common Sense*. It became a best seller, and convinced many colonists to support the independence movement.

Thomas Paine's thinking was years, if not centuries, ahead of his time. Paine argued for social security, higher education, and women's rights. He was an abolitionist and recognized that unnecessary war opens a vein that can bleed a nation to death.

How appropriate that a group formed in 2002 to protest the run-up to war in Iraq would honor Thomas Paine and *Common Sense* in its name. Since its founding, Florida Veterans for Common Sense has dedicated its actions towards informing the community on matters affecting national defense, active duty military and veterans' issues. An ongoing effort is to obtain Veterans Diversion Courts in Florida which could divert veterans, as appropriate, from criminal prosecution to employment, psychological counseling, and drug or alcohol abuse treatment.

On Sat., June 9, Gene Jones will introduce the work of Florida Veterans for Common Sense and a short dramatization of Thomas Paine's relevance to modern America. Actor Barry Look plays the role of Thomas Paine and the American Troubadour Bill Schustik performs revolutionary and patriotic songs. They present this program in honor of Paine's birthday every January for the FLVCS, and now, for the first time, they are bringing it to the Democratic Club of Sarasota.

This special event will be at a special location — the Sarasota Yacht Club. Exercise your common sense and be there on June 9.

Last Month: Innocence Project of Florida's Seth Miller: Poverty Leads to Injustice

"The opposite of poverty is justice." May luncheon speaker Seth Miller, Executive Director of the Innocence Project of Florida (IPF), explained that poverty is the cause of much injustice. The main reason innocent people are convicted is that they can't afford the kind of legal representation they need.

IPF's mission is to free wrongly-convicted Florida prisoners using DNA. Because only about 10% of all cases involve biological evidence and IPF's resources are limited, they can help very few of the innocent.

DNA testing has been around only about 25 years. One of the

challenges the innocent face is getting the state to test the DNA evidence. Five times over an 8 year period, Florida denied requests from James Bain to test the DNA evidence from the rape for which he was given a life sentence. After IPF took his case, he was exonerated after spending 35 years in prison. Even dealing with IPF, law enforcement has sometimes been uncooperative, denying the existence of evidence or failing to locate it.

Until 2008, exonerated prisoners were not compensated for time served under Florida law. Miller challenged his audience to consider the plight of someone who spent 35

years in prison, who was unable to continue his education, have a career or family — or even qualify for Social Security or Medicare because he didn't pay into the system.

Florida denies exonerated prisoners transition services that it provides to guilty prisoners who are released at the end of their sentences. IPF tries to connect their freed clients with needed social services that are free or pro bono.

While in Law School at FSU, Miller was a student intern at IPF. Students are the "lifeblood of what we do," he said. Attending the May luncheon were New College Professor Dr. Brooke Butler and a group of her students who are Innocence Project volunteers.

When asked how Democratic Club members could help IPF, Miller responded that tax-deductible donations are appreciated (Floridalnnocence.org on the web), as are opportunities for him to make people aware of IPF's work.
